The advertisements are approved by the University and the Joint Director of Higher Education. The selection committees are constituted by the University of Pune. These committees consist of the Vice Chancellor's nominee, subject experts and the management's representative. These committees interview the eligible candidates and select them on the basis of merit and reservation policies laid by the goverment. The selected candidates are recruited in various Colleges as per their needs.

Hence, the College does not need any merit list or entrance test for the students seeking admissions to F.Y.B.A/B.Com / B.Sc. Admissions are thus given on the first come first served basis.
