



Role of Teachers in Imparting Value Education in Colleges

Value based education integrates educational and cultural values among students. Its aim is to achieve multi-faceted development of a human being i.e. intellectual, physical, spiritual, and ethical development. Values are conceptualized as long-term beliefs that individuals hold about specific modes of conduct which they believe are more important. Values conscious or unconscious, internal or external are affectively loaded cognitive components which works as a filter or frame of reference, principles, standards, for seeking inputs and linking to action.

Actually value education should start from home, but there are limitations for parents also. They may give love to their children but not their thoughts because children have their own thoughts. Parents may house their bodies but not their souls because their souls dwell in the house of tomorrow, which parents neither visit nor even imagine in dreams.

Why teachers are very important? Teachers are pillars in Social Development. Role of teacher is very important in imparting Value Education. Education is one of the most important tools in bringing about socio-economic & cultural progress in a country. 6. Ultimately universal values such as Contentment, Love, Peace, Truth, Wisdom, Integrity, Justice, Co-Existence, Service & Devotion.

Therefore, teachers have to provide learning experiences for holistic development of mind, body intellect and emotions. So the challenge is to advocate teacher's education such that teachers can take care of the holistic education of children. This would require value oriented teacher education. In order to propagate moral values among undergraduate students, the Savitribai Phule Pune University has launched value education for the promotion of ethical values among college students. Under this programme with the help of National Service Scheme colleges conduct value education classes for the students. The University also provides financial support to arrange workshops, seminars & classes of value education. Under the value education programme, the lecturers talk to students about the importance of education, social responsibility, society, self-discipline and the pros and cons of western lifestyle. With this initiative the University can start the programme for value education for the students of first year compulsorily in the academic year. The course should be well-designed to provide moral teachings to the present generation with hope that value education would bring some attitudinal change among the student community. The university already started one program at Second Year level about Environmental awareness. Similarly for the first year students can have the course on Value Education with certain credit points . The final year results will be declared after completion of this course. This course will be in lecture methods & would impart moral values to the students in the regular classes. Further training programme for the lecturers can be arranged & books can be made available on how to impart moral and value education to students. In this manner the collegiate education authorities can prepare books for students on value education and to sensitise students about the values of

Since independence education system in the country has expanded very rapidly. In spite of the recommendation of the several commissions on education that education in human values should be made an integral part of the curriculum, it is hardly visible in the schools because one may think that or suspicious that value education might be used for religious education.
